Each firm takes a unique approach to presenting their work and reflecting on the UD DC theme of the year. Taken together, the open houses displayed an ambition and sensitivity to the task of citymaking, weaving together diverse project narratives with fundamental issues being faced in today's day and age.














film screening & panel events

The Urban Design Committee organizes a film screening bookended by a panel discussion focusing on the UD DC's theme of the year.

In the first part of the event, panelists engaged in a discussion about the topic. Immediately thereafter, participants enjoy the movie screening. The panelists then addressed questions from the audience with impressions from the flm and implications for life in the District. These events are often held in various locations throughout the city, allowing us to discover new urban spaces and occupy them in new ways.







idea competitions

The UD DC organizes an ideas competition that tasks participants to refect on the changing nature of retail in contemporary city life, questioning how that change could be harnessed to improve drivers of UD DC's theme of the year.

Conceived anew each year, the competition aims to be a repository for innovative ideas surrounding each year's theme. Past topics have included reconsidering the future of urban retail and understanding how borders (both visible and invisible) shape our lives and the places we live.








avenues

AVENUES, the UD DC's annual journal, not only records the events of the past year, but primarily collects thoughtful and provocative articles focused on the year's theme. Each volume is organized into four sections: provocations, ethos, idea, and happenings. Provocations are a series of writings that try to ask more questions than they answer, raising questions that must be grappled with in today's cities. Ethos describes how various professionals and firms approach their daily work and affect change in urban areas around the world. Ideas catalogs some of the most innovative competition entries from each year. Happenings creates a taxonomy of the events hosted by the UD DC in the past year.









city nature challenge & Panel Discussion

The UD DC partners with ASLA Potomac chapter, Capital Nature and CNC-DC to celebrate the earth/ citizen science month and organize a week long "nature scavenger hunt".


