
## CAN A CHURCH RESTORATION REVIVE ITS COMMUNITY?

## CHURCH OF ASCENSION AND ST. AGNES PARISH CENTER


The Church of the Ascension and Saint Agnes (ASA) is a cultural & architectural anchor at the corner of 12th Street NW and Massachusetts Avenue NW. The project implements a pervious Master Plan whereby two elements – a Parish Center Renovation and a 35-unit Housing Redevelopment – provide for the restoration of the Church building and the ongoing financial stability of the parish.


At the Parish Center, 1960s-era infill between the church (aligned parallel to 12th St) and the rowhome next door (aligned perpendicular to Massachusetts Ave) is removed, restoring the wedge-shaped space to its original function – a lightwell for the church's western facade – plus much-needed program and circulation space. The project brings the church campus into full compliance with the ADA. Paramount to the design is the re-exposure of the church's western facade – to light, to passerby, and as an experiential presence in the daily use of the church.







## PARISH CENTER DIAGRAM












PROPOSED PLAN " LVL °






PROPOSED PLAN ~ LVL ° ,
